3. What holiday do peple in Canada celebrate on the second Monday in October?

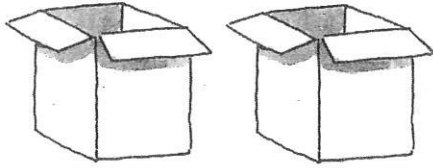

The First Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving is a time to remember all that we have to be thankful for. We gather with family and friends to enjoy a big feast. It is celebrated on the fourth Thursday in November in the United States.

The first Thanksgiving took place in 1621. One year before, the Pilgrims had landed in Plymouth Rock in what is now the state of Massachusetts. That first winter was very harsh. There was little food and many of the colonists died. A Native American named Squanto became a friend to the Pilgrims and taught them how to fish and plant crops. Without his help, many more colonists would not have survived. There was much to celebrate the next fall. The governor of Plymouth, William Bradford, declared a day of thanks for their good harvest. The Native Americans were invited and they spent three days eating and celebrating. Some dishes the Pilgrims ate probably included fish, duck, seafood, deer, corn and squash.

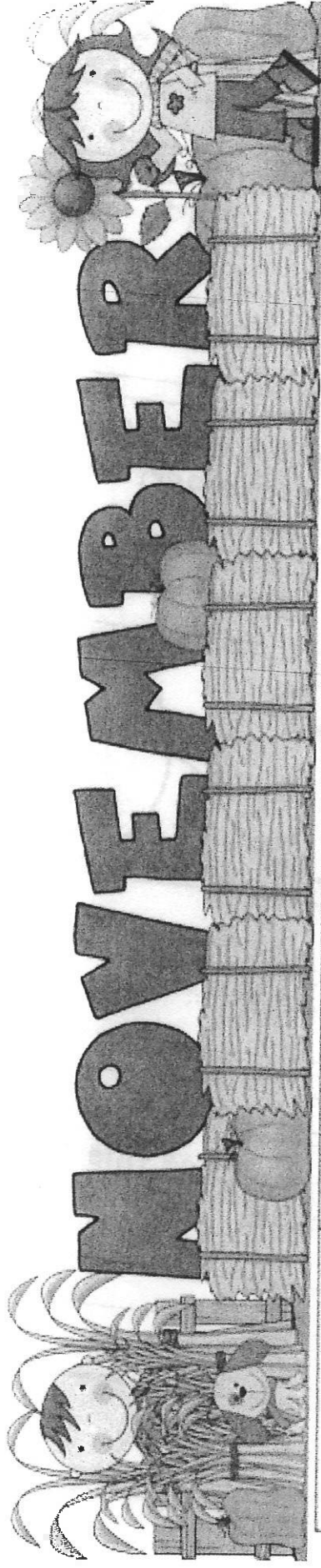
