
Dear Parents,


Grow a Tree

Growing your own apple tree from a seed can be fun. It just takes a lot of time to grow! First: Eat an apple. Be careful to save six or eight of the seeds. Second: Rinse the seeds in cool water. Third: Wrap the seeds in a paper towel or napkin and put them in a safe place in the refrigerator for about three weeks. Fourth: Put the seeds in a cup or glass. Cover them with water. Leave them in a warm place to soak for three or four days. Fifth: Plant the seeds in a small pot of soil. Keep them well watered. Sixth: When the seedlings grow to be three inches tall, separate them. Give each seed its own pot. Seventh: When the apple plants outgrow the pot, plant them in a special place in your yard. Last: Be patient! It takes a long time to grow into a good sized tree.
